For many the season of Spring is a favourite so welcome in spring and get the growing season off to a great start. It's an exciting time of year to be gardening as many plants are bursting into life. Show your garden some love this month to get everything in shape for the summer. This is an ideal time for planting flowering shrubs so they can become established before the heat of summer.

Our climbers have arrived and we have the most gorgeous flowering **Clematis** and **Jasmine**, flowering now.

Before planting anything new, prepare the soil by removing weeds and adding compost or manure. When planting, dig a hole that's twice as big as the root ball and be generous with compost in the planting hole.

- Tomatoes, Zucchini, Cucumber, Chilies, Pumpkin and Capsicum seedlings
- Vege seedlings: Peas, Broccoli, Beetroot, Cauli, Cabbage, Bok Choi, Rocket, Lettuce, Silverbeet, and Spinach
- The Herb Bed begins to swell with fresh stock weekly
- Flowering Bedding –summer bedding has arrived such as Lobelia, Petunia, Cornflower, Nasturtium. Lavender, Osteospermum, Foxgloves, Geraniums, Pansies, Sweet Pea and Violas
- Bulbs, a few Dahlias left, expecting the Flag Irises and Gladioli bulbs (these have been rumoured to be the latest craze to plant)
- Potted Colour; so much colour, you can't go wrong
- Roses these are looking spectacular, starting to leaf up beautifully
- Citrus Healthy lemons, oranges, grapefruit, mandarins and limes

The little Market

We get many positive comments about this space. Customer enjoy finding treasures that are a little different. There are still some Alliums available plus gorgeous woodland plants, Violets, Grape Hyacinths and Trilliums. and Hellebores. We will soon have available "Portstone grown" tomato seedlings, courgettes and flowering annuals. **Hydrangeas** - New seasons plants are arriving weekly. Hydrangeas are an ideal choice for mass plantings as they give months of flowers, even when they have finished flowering they still look attractive.

If you haven't already, you need to remove the dead flowerheads, cutting back the stem to the first strong, healthy pair of buds down from the faded bloom. Hydrangeas flower on new growth, so avoid cutting into 'old wood', as this can reduce flowering for the next couple of summers.

Give your lawn some love after a hard winter; repair and reseed any bare patches on your lawn that may have appeared during winter - rake off any leaves and add a layer of lawn compost before sowing. If the weather is dry enough, you may be able to cut your lawn; make sure the blade of your lawnmower is not too low and cut long grass with a strimmer before mowing.
